# FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY

## RABBI ANDREW WARMFLASH



Unlike every other Jewish holiday, there is no ready ritual or unique object associated with Shavuot. On Passover, we eat matzah and attend the seder. Tisha B'Av is observed by fasting and reading the book of Aicha (Lamentations). Rosh Hashanah brings the sounding of the shofar and eating apples with honey. On Yom Kippur, we fast and pray all day. Sukkot involves waving a lulav and etrog and dwelling in the sukkah. On Chanukah we light candles; on Purim we read Megillat Esther and give mishloach manot. But what unique mitzvah is associated with Shavuot? A tradition has arisen of eating cheesecake and blintzes – but there must be more to the holiday than great dairy food.

Shavuot is known in our liturgy as “z'man matan torateinu – the time of the giving of our Torah.” Exodus 19:17, which we read on Shavuot, describes the Israelites as they were receiving the Torah of Sinai as “b'takhtit hahar,” which literally means “under the mountain.”

Under the mountain? A midrash explains that God uprooted the mountain from its place and held it over the heads of our ancestors like a casket, saying to them, “If you accept the Torah, then all is well but if not, this place will be your place of burial.”

But if God forced the Israelites to accept Torah, observes the sage Rav Acha Bar Yaakov, then they did so under duress and we, the descendants of a people forced to accept the Torah, are not bound!

“No,” answers another Talmudic sage named Rava. “Subsequent generations of Jews reaffirmed their commitment to Torah.” We do not rely on the original revelation at Sinai. Rather, every generation must take hold of the Torah and make it their own.

Perhaps this need for continual reappropriation of Torah explains why there isn't any specific ritual that is associated exclusively with Shavuot. On all the other holidays, the associated ritual that we observe is limited to that holiday. We attend a seder on Passover – but not during the rest of the year. We fast and read Lamentations only on Tisha B'Av. We light Chanukah candles during the eight nights of Chanukah and we hear Megillat Esther on Purim – but not during the rest of the year. The rituals come and go with the holiday itself.

Accepting the Torah at Sinai and recommitting to it in our own way is not limited to the two days of the festival – it must take place every day of the year. The meaning of this non-ritual of Shavuot is timeless: each generation's new struggle to find resonance and relevance in God's ancient words.

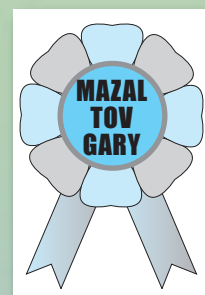

# HOLIDAYS

## LAG B'OMER

Lag B'Omer is the 33rd day of the Omer (the 49 days counted between Pesach and Shavuot), which this year falls on May 2. Having no calendar, the Jews of ancient times counted the days from the second day of Pesach (the start of the cereal harvest) until Shavuot, when they would gather the harvest. Lag B'Omer is a solitary joyous day in this solemn period of the Jewish calendar, when so much Jewish persecution is remembered. On this day, we remember the miraculous cessation of a terrible plague that raged among Rabbi Akiva's students. The *yahrzeit* of Simeon Bar Yohai, a great Jewish scholar who hid in a cave, living off carob and spring water when the Romans forbade the study of Torah, is also commemorated. When his students came to visit him, they disguised themselves as hunters with bows and arrows, hence the bows and arrows children play with on Lag B'Omer today. We also remember the amazing determination and bravery of Bar Kochba and his small, ill-equipped Jewish army in withstanding the mighty Roman army for three long years.

In most countries, Lag B'Omer is celebrated with picnics, field days and games of skill. In Israel, many Jews visit the grave of Rabbi Simeon Bar Yohai in Meron. Bonfires are lit and there is singing and dancing throughout the night because Rabbi Bar Yohai requested that his followers celebrate, rather than mourn, his death. The bonfires also remind us that the torch of Jewish learning continues to burn, despite cruel persecutions by tyrants throughout the centuries.

## SHAVUOT

Shavuot means "weeks" and it falls exactly seven weeks after the second day of Pesach, on the 6th and 7th of Sivan.

Shavuot is a three-fold celebration which commemorates the giving of the Torah on Mount Sinai, the wheat harvest and the ripening of the first fruits in Israel. The Rabbis of old declared Shavuot to be the most pleasant of all Jewish holidays. In ancient times, the cereal harvest began on the second day of Passover with the ripening of barley. On this day, an omer or measure of grain was brought to the Temple as a thanksgiving to God. The 49 days were counted until Shavuot and this period is still called *Sefirat HaOmer* or the counting of the Omer. A special prayer was and still is said at the end of the Evening Service during this period. In a way, it fits in very well with Passover and brings that great festival to a glorious conclusion. On Passover the Jews were freed from slavery and on Shavuot the freed slaves were made into free men by the Ten Commandments.

**SHAVUOT CUSTOMS:** In Israel, children usually march through the streets with baskets of fruit and beautifully decorated floats, in commemoration of the ancient festival processions carrying thanksgiving offerings to the Temple. Synagogues and homes in countries all over the world are decorated with plants, flowers and greenery.

On the first night of Shavuot, the Evening Service is delayed until absolute nightfall to be sure the 49 days of counting are completed. Many observant Jews spend the whole first night studying Torah. During the day, the Scroll of Ruth is read at Services because this story describes harvesting in Palestine. On the second day, *Yizkor* is said. It is also customary to eat dairy foods, symbolizing the fact that the Torah is likened to "milk and honey."

These are hard economic times and everyone is concerned about the well-being of our country and our own families. I have listened to many of our mothers saying that because of the economy, they are returning to the work force and leaving their children home most of the day to grandparents and caregivers.

Their decision to return to work is a difficult one and I hope in light of the fact Mother's Day is around the corner, I can shed a positive spin on this decision.

When I left my teaching job to become a full time mother, I had a glorious vision of how life was going to be. There I was in my dream, playing with my children all day long, giving them meals that they loved, having a husband that came home and worked with me in the kitchen. It as just like I had seen on T.V. shows such as "Father Knows Best." What was I thinking?

Somehow or other, my mother exhibited the qualities I thought I would have when I became a mother myself. She was a full time nurturing mother. She was home everyday I came home from school waiting with a great snack, loving hug and time to listen to my idle chatter about the day's events. She helped my sister and me do our homework, saw to it that we got a good night's sleep and always had time to make my father a full meal... Since she did not drive, my mother walked to the shopping center, did a full food shop and walked

back home. She never complained and always made motherhood look so easy. You can only imagine how much I was looking forward to becoming the mother she was when I had my children.

I do not remember when I realized that I was NOT my mother, but the image I had in my head about how things were suppose to be was fading with each year I parented my daughters. I was part of a new generation of women in the 70's who found motherhood not completely fulfilling, I needed to go back to work either full time or part time. I missed my weekly paychecks that patted me on my back for a job well done.

It is now commonplace for women to hold jobs while managing the house and caring for their families. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the number of working moms had increased over the last thirty years to a whopping 73 percent.

In 1998, Catalyst, a non-profit New York advocacy group for women in business, prepared a survey of two-career couples and discovered that two-thirds of the women would continue working with or without the financial need to do so.

Many women adore their role as a mother and regard each day with their children as a gift. Then there are those who say that if they knew motherhood would be this difficult, they would never have had children. Many mothers say that they have become better mothers to

their children since they returned to work because they have a new sense of self-worth and feeling of independence. Some mothers feel ashamed to admit this, particularly to other mothers who might judge them because they have left their children home for others to raise.

Motherhood is a full time job. It does not end at 5:00 o'clock as outside jobs do. There is not a regular paycheck coming in to reward you and there are not many people in your life that pat you on the back for all the talent you need to have to deal with the hundreds of tasks you do as a stay-at-home parent. The rewards of motherhood come in hugs and sticky kisses on a daily basis, and hopefully in the long run when you watch your child grow to be a caring, independent adult.

My wish for mothers who are economically trapped and must return to the work force, is that you maintain a good balance between work and being with your children. Make sure that when you get home, you spend time listening to your child's day and not get too involved in the household jobs you think have to be done immediately. Make a mental note to leave work at work. Try to accept that while your role as both a mother and a worker carries equal weight in your life, there is just so much one person can accomplish in one day. Whether you are a stay-at-home mom or a mom who goes to work, make sure that you add time in your week for yourself.
