# FROM THE PRESIDENT

November and December are cold. And much of the time, dark. But even during difficult and confusing times, there are so many warm and bright spots.

I feel oddly happy as I'm writing this column, despite my usual deadline anxiety. Maybe it's the sort of family feeling—the good kind—a sense of connection—that has been growing on me during these years in the presidency which was hugely reinforced over the holidays.

It seems like just a minute ago that we were working on the logistics for Rosh Hashanah and then all of a sudden we were freezing the leftover bagels and cleaning up the crumbs from the break fast after Yom Kippur. It's not that I felt particularly prepared for the High Holidays this year, or that I atoned more effectively—or even enough. But oh, I enjoyed myself!

You can't imagine (unless, perhaps, you're a past president of this or a similar organization) how wonderful it is to scan through the congregation and see families together, sometimes with the addition of a baby or a fiance(e), and note the loving relationships between grandparent and grandchildren, and spouses sitting shoulder to shoulder, and children you knew as adolescents who are now college graduates, and children you knew as kindergartners who now read Torah. You might also be surprised to know just how inspiring it is to see new members participating, younger members getting involved at a deeper level, and members who expressed their sense of disconnection now committing to be a part of creating whatever our future is going to be.

Okay, I understand that this might be a rosy view. All these happy families are not happy all the time, and we confront various bobbles and messes now and then. But to feel that we are all in community, that we care about each other, that we are a self-sustaining organism that refreshes and revives itself, that encourages new growth and deepening loyalty, well, it's more thrilling than you might think.

It is with this sense of warmth and light that I want to encourage you to consider a couple of areas where you and HERJC might connect a little bit more. The first is our Adult B'nai Mitzvah class, and the second is our planned series of once-a-month Friday night family services. Both are ways to connect to each other and our tradition.

Even in the dark and the cold, we have gratitude at Thanksgiving and rededication at Hanukkah. Let me know how you're connecting.

# FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY

## RABBI ANDREW WARMFLASH



### God's Busy Day

What is God's day like? In the Talmud, in the tractate Avodah Zarah 3b, our sages tell us that God's day is divided into quarters, during each of which God is fully occupied.

In the first quarter, God studies Torah. In the second quarter, God judges the world, moving from the throne of Justice to the seat of Mercy when God sees guilt that could spell destruction. In the third quarter, God feeds the world and all its creatures. And in the fourth quarter, God teaches school children.

What are we to make of this ancient text that portrays God as scholar, judge, social activist and teacher of children? The answer to this question is suggested by a teaching about Hanukkah, which begins this year on Sunday evening, December 21.

In the Talmud, tractate Shabbat 21b, we learn that the reason we light one candle on the first night and one more candle each night, is *ma'alim b'kodesh v'eyn moridin*—in matters of holiness, we go up, but not down. As the festival proceeds, we want more light, more radiance, more holiness; not less, and therefore we add a candle each night.

On Hanukkah, fulfilling this imperative to ascend in holiness is relatively easy, requiring only a new candle. What about the rest of the year? How do we ascend in holiness? The answer is to emulate God's busy day.

First, we study Torah, because doing so leads us to acts of righteousness and kindness.

Second, in our interactions with one another, we can shift from the theme of Justice to the seat of Mercy, by giving one another the benefit of the doubt and showing each other *rachmanut* compassion.

Third, just as God feeds the hungry, there are so many things we can do to help others and improve our world.

Finally, as God is a teacher of children, we can teach our children and grandchildren, by example, so that a new generation will be imbued with the richness and joy of Jewish living.

By learning Torah, displaying compassion, doing deeds of social justice and teaching our children, we act like God—and we are *ma'alim b'kodesh*, we ascend in holiness.

With best wishes for a de-light-ful Hanukkah!

# NOTES FROM THE CANTOR

As we enter December and the Hebrew month of Kislev we welcome a holiday that brings warmth, sweets and laughter to this dark and gloomy time of year. Hanukkah has come to greet us with dreidel games, delicious jelly donuts, music for all to enjoy and candles shining brightly. We recall the Maccabee family and how they saved us from Greek defeat, but more importantly the miracle of finding virgin olive oil in the midst of desecration and the miracle of it lasting for eight full days so that our great Temple could be aglow again. In fact, like other holidays, Hanukkah is marked with its own special practices: we read a special *haftarah* and *Torah* reading every morning during Hanukkah. We also insert a special line into our daily davening: *al hanisim v'al hapurkan v'al hag'vurot v'al hatshuot v'al hamilchamot she-asita lavotenu bayamim hahem bazman hazeh.*

This text praises God for the miracles of yesterday and today. As we light each Hanukkah candle this year, we should think about all the other families who are celebrating this beautiful holiday as well and imagine that, with each blessing we utter, our voices come together as one.

In the spirit of Hanukkah, I would like to share the beautiful song below. **Not by Might and Not by Power** by Craig Taubman and Debbie Friedman talks about how the children are our voice, our miracle and how they are the power that keeps us connected to God. Children, so innocent, have faith and hope. They believe, and we should look to our children for that spark with the Almighty. 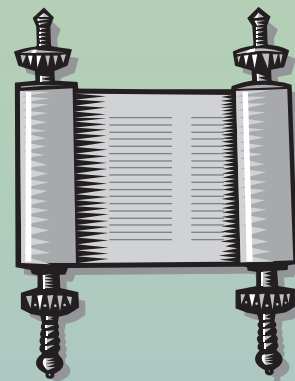

# HANUKKAH

## The Lighting of Hanukkah Candles

The celebration of Hanukkah begins on the twenty-fifth day of the Hebrew month of Kislev. On this day, a small group of Maccabean soldiers were victorious over the great Greek army, and the desecrated Temple was rededicated to the service of God. We light candles for eight days, beginning on the evening of December 21, in commemoration of the famous miracle of the oil. After the Maccabean victory, one single crucible of oil (enough to light the Temple Menorah for only one day) was found. Miraculously, however, it lasted for eight days, long enough for new consecrated oil to be prepared.

The Hanukkah menorah (Hanukkia) has nine candles, eight of which represent the eight days of Hanukkah. The ninth candle, the Shamash, is used to light the other candles and usually towers above the rest.

The Hanukkah lights may be lit by any member of the family. In many families, each member lights his or her own Hanukkia.

## Traditional Latkes



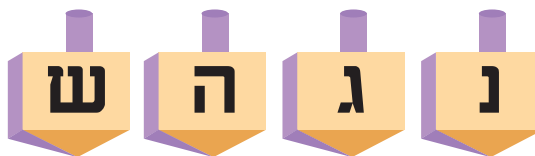
- 2 cups grated potatoes
- small onion
- 2 eggs
- 2 tbsp. flour or matza meal
- 1 tsp. salt
- oil

## RULES FOR PLAYING DREIDEL

Everyone starts with an equal number of nuts, raisins, pennies or whatever! Each player puts one of these in the middle. The first player spins the dreidel.

*If it lands on:*

<b>Nun</b> . . . . .	the player does nothing . . . . .	N = Nothing
<b>Gimmel</b> . . . . .	the player takes everything in the middle . . . . .	G = Get
<b>Hay</b> . . . . .	the player takes half . . . . .	H = Half
<b>Shin</b> . . . . .	the player puts one in . . . . .	S = Share

*An easy way to remember is:*

Before the next player spins, everyone puts in another piece.

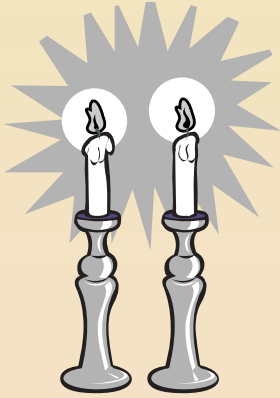

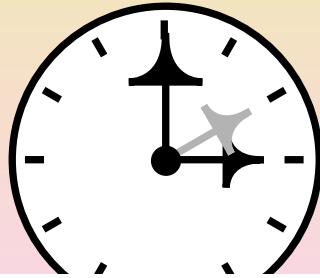

## Order of Lighting the Hanukkah Candles



The candles are placed from right to left, as one faces the Hanukkia (as Hebrew is read). But they are lit from left to right, so that on each night, the new candle is given special welcome by being lit first. Only the Shamash is used to light the other candles.

The candles should be lit as soon as possible once it is dark. On Friday night, however, the Hanukkah candles are lit BEFORE the Shabbat candles. At the close of Shabbat, the Havdalah ceremony precedes the lighting of the Hanukkia.

# OUR JEWISH FUTURE

## NURSERY SCHOOL

**CHERYL KARP**



Probably one of the most difficult tasks parents need to learn is the art of active listening. Many years ago, when I began parenting my own children I was fortunate to discover and incorporate this skill in my everyday communication with them. The skill of active listening is vital and necessary in order to become an

effective parent. Active listening is a way of listening and responding to another person that improves mutual understanding. Often when people talk to each other, they don't listen attentively. Parents are so busy multi-tasking that they are often distracted, half-listening, half-thinking about something else. When people are engaged in a conflict, they are often busy formulating a response to what is being said rather than active listening. They assume that they have heard what their opponent is saying many times before, so rather than paying attention they focus on how they can respond to win the argument.

I once read a wonderful story by Leo Buscaglia about a contest he was asked to judge. The purpose of the contest was to find the most caring child. The winner was a four-year-old child whose next door neighbor was an elderly gentleman who had recently lost his wife. Upon seeing the man cry, the little boy went into the old gentleman's yard, climbed onto his lap, and just sat there. When his mother asked him what he had said to the neighbor, the little boy said, "Nothing, I just helped him cry." Active listening can also be the art of listening with your eyes and heart and knowing that sometimes people just need time to express their deepest emotions without a response from the listener.

Empathic, active listening is the greatest gift parents can give to their children. It is our duty as parents to

put ourselves in our children's place—to walk in their shoes—and understand where the child is coming from without imposing our point of view. I leave you with this wonderful message written by Herbert Lingren. It is message to all of us who want to make a better world by teaching our children how to incorporate the art of active listening into their everyday lives.

I speak because I know my needs,  
I speak with hesitation because I know not yours,  
My words come from my life's experiences  
Your understanding comes from yours.  
Because of this, what I say,  
And what you hear, may not be the same.  
So if you will listen carefully,  
Not only with your ears,  
But with your eyes and with your heart,  
Maybe somehow we can communicate.

## RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

There was a stretch when a number of my colleagues felt an interesting discomfort in being called the *Chosen* People. Instead, they touted themselves as the *Choosing* People. Without getting overly involved in a discussion about whether or not God called us to be distinct from the other nations of the Earth, there is still great merit in being a *choosing* people.

At each point in our personal and communal experience, we are called upon to choose, to make a choice. Right and wrong. Good and bad. Life and death. In each, the lessons of Judaism direct us to make a choice; the right choice; the good choice; the choice for life.

As teachers and parents, there are few things we do that are more important than modeling the ability to

choose wisely and thoughtfully. With that in mind, I would urge all of you to discuss with your children your choice for President and other offices this year. Take your children with you to the polling place (I take it as a matter of faith that you will vote!) Explain how wonderful it is to live in a country where voting is possible.

And then, come December, when we celebrate Hanukkah and remember when the Jews had to make a choice to live as Jews rather than as assimilated members of a Hellenistic culture, remind your children why giving gifts on Hanukkah is fun and lovely, but that the important thing is the choosing. Every day, we choose to be the people—as individuals and as a community—which we have been chosen to try to be.
