



[Our Favorite Books for Babies at the HERJC Nursery School](#)







The combination of gentle good night rhymes and illustrations of a child's room, filled with familiar objects such as a rocking chair, a brush, clocks and socks and kittens, help even the most sleep averse baby get ready for bedtime. 




[Urban Babies Wear Black](#) by Michelle Sinclair Coleman. This is a the first in a very clever series of board books that are perfect for yuppie parents with a sense of humor. 
[On The Day You Were Born](#) by Debra Frasier has sold over 1 million copies. This book helps baby understand how each of us is received by our family and by the world. The simple pictures, reminiscent of Matisse, helped win the book a Parents Choice Award. For babies born in the evening, there is also [On the Night You Were Born](#) by Nancy Tilman, which celebrates the uniqueness of being a newborn. These books are wonderful gifts for newborns.



[Home Run! My Baseball Book](#) by David Diehl. We searched for this series of board books because many parents wanted to buy baby's first sports books. Diehl's pictures convey the spirit of baseball, from a batter hitting a home run to a pitcher winding up for a strike. There is also [Slam Dunk](#), [Touch Down](#), [Goal](#) and a [Sports ABC](#) board book.



[That's Not My Monkey](#) by Fiona Watt and Rachel Wells is part of the very popular Usborne Touchy Feely Board Book series that includes a number of similar books, like [That's Not My Tractor](#), [That's Not my Kitten](#), [That's Not my Dinosaur](#), [That's Not my Princess](#), etc. These are wonderful touch and feel book, with a tiny mouse on each page that toddlers love to find.



[How Do Dinosaurs Learn Their Colors?](#) By Jane Yolen and Mark Teague is part of another great series for little ones who love dinosaurs (and who doesn't?). This book focuses on colors and is packed with pictures of dinosaurs drawing, painting and playing, and it is also [available in Spanish](#). There are other, longer picture books like [How Do Dinosaurs Say I Love You?](#) and [How Do Dinosaurs Say Good Night?](#)



The Pigeon Loves Things That Go! By Mo Willems is a book about a pigeon that emotes about driving a plane, a train, a car and more. If you haven't read Willems's books yet, you will! He's the Dr. Seuss to this generation of children. (We also sell the plush pigeon who yells "Let me drive the bus!" in our store).
